

4 EACH recipients

The EACH program is now an established and growing program of community aged care designed to provide the equivalent of high-level residential care to people living in their homes in the community. The EACH program provides a similar range of services to care recipients as CACPs, with the addition of nursing and allied health services. Recipients require approval from an Aged Care Assessment Team to access an EACH package. The EACH program is currently being complemented with the allocation of 2,000 EACH Dementia packages over the 4 years from 2006 to 2009. The first EACH Dementia packages commenced in March 2006.

While the number of people receiving EACH packages has increased by 928 (77%) in the last financial year, the size of the program is still small. This limits the level of analysis which it is sensible to attempt at this point. It is important to note that the care recipient profile may be relatively unstable over the next few years as the program grows and matures. The characteristics of EACH recipients in 5 years time may be quite different in some respects from those of the current service population.

The following sections describe the characteristics of EACH package recipients at 30 June 2006 and admissions and separations from 1 July 2005 to 30 June 2006, the details of which are provided in Tables 4.1 to 4.18. The characteristics of EACH Dementia package recipients are covered in Chapter 5 of this report.

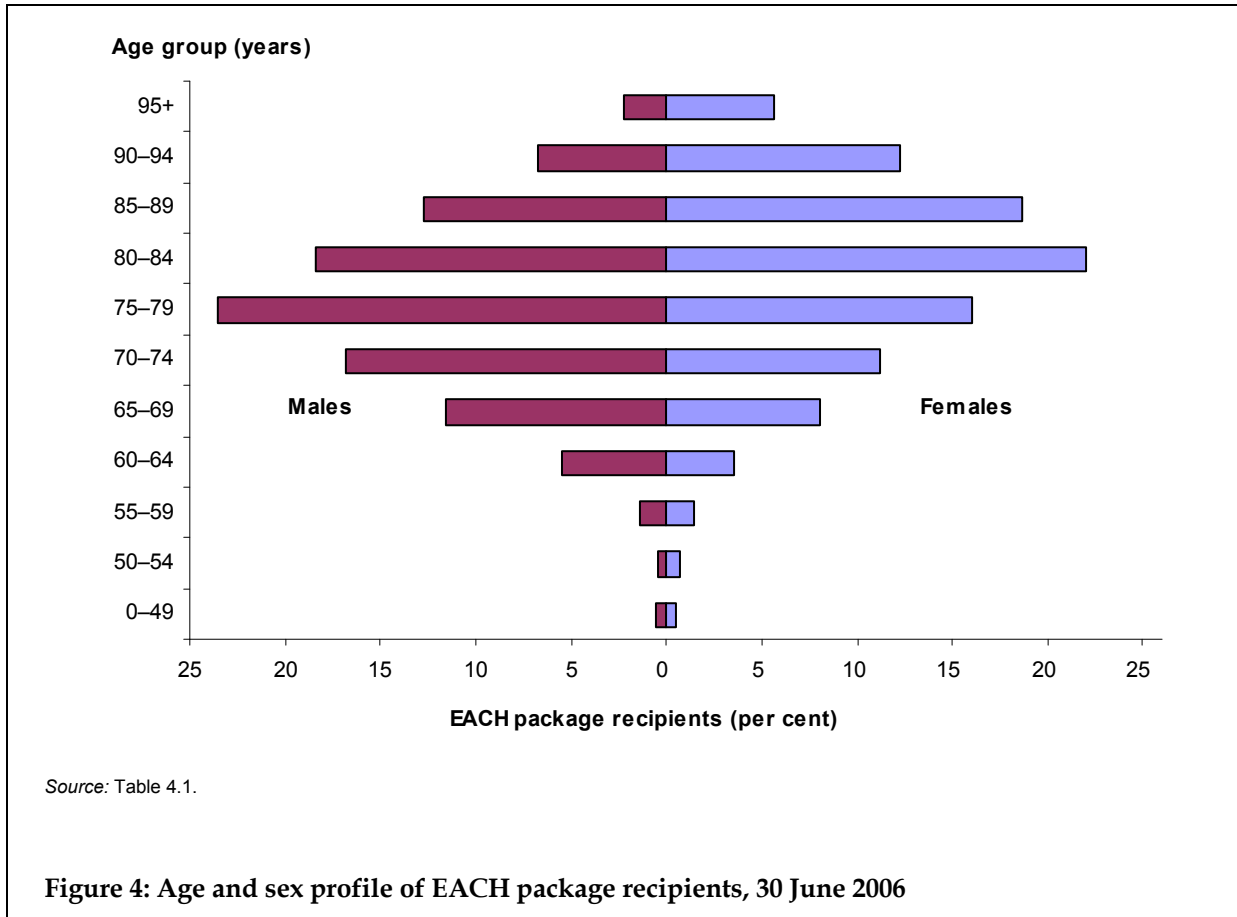
4.1 Location

There were 2,131 EACH package recipients at 30 June 2006. The recipient distributions at 30 June 2006 across states and territories were Victoria (31%), New South Wales (29%), Queensland (17%), South Australia (9%) and Western Australia (7%) (see Table 4.1). The Australian Capital Territory, Tasmania and the Northern Territory all had small numbers of recipients; 60 (2%), 49 (3%), and 43 (2%), respectively. The majority of EACH package recipients (65%) were located in major cities, with 25% in inner regional areas and 10% in outer regional areas (Table 4.3).

4.2 Age and sex distribution

At 30 June 2006, 1,289 (60%) EACH package recipients were women and 842 (40%) were men. This sex profile was similar across states and territories with the exception of the Northern Territory, where there were 25 male and 18 female EACH recipients.

Forty-nine per cent of EACH package recipients were less than 80 years of age. Male care recipients were younger than females, with 60% of males less than 80 years compared to 41% of female recipients. EACH package recipients had a younger age profile than CACP recipients, with only 37% of CACP care recipients who were younger than 80 years of age. About 7% of EACH package recipients were aged under 65 years and less than 1% were under the age of 50 years (Table 4.1, Figure 4).



4.3 Birthplace and preferred language

Birthplace and preferred language were recorded for almost all care recipients—90% of recipients at 30 June 2006 were born either in Australia (64%), the United Kingdom and Ireland (10%) or European countries (17%). Although 80% of recipients preferred to speak English, 15% preferred to speak a European language (Tables 4.4 and 4.5).

People from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds are defined as those born in countries other than Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and Ireland, Canada, South Africa and the United States of America. Age-specific usage rates of EACH were nearly twice as high for recipients aged 75–84 and 85 years and over from a non-English-speaking background compared with Australian-born and English-speaking overseas-born recipients (Table 4.11). The small numbers need to be taken into account for this measure.

4.4 Living arrangements

The question that care recipients were asked in relation to their living arrangements at the time of their application for a package was: ‘With whom do you normally live?’ For those who were EACH package recipients at 30 June 2006, 57% lived with family, 2% lived with others. For an additional 16% of care recipients no answer was recorded for this question but they were reported to have a co-resident carer. This high percentage of care recipients who

did not live alone (76%) reflects the importance of informal care arrangements in supporting a high-care recipient in their home. This care is more commonly provided by family. However, there was still a significant proportion of these high-care recipients (17%) who lived alone (Table 4.6). Victoria had the highest percentage of recipients who did not live alone (82%) and Tasmania and South Australia had the lowest at (59%).

4.5 Indigenous care recipients

Twenty-four out of the 2,131 recipients identified as being Indigenous and 12 recipients were of unknown status (Tables 4.7 and 4.8). The low representation of Indigenous care recipients is likely to be influenced by the very small number of packages available in remote areas (4) and the absence of packages in very remote areas (see Table 2.3).

4.6 Carer status

Most EACH package recipients (90%) received assistance from a carer; 74% had a co-resident carer, 16% had a carer who did not live with the care recipient, and 10% of care recipients did not have a carer. A higher percentage of male care recipients had a carer (92%) than females (88%), but the main difference was the proportion of carers who lived with the care recipient; 87% of carers of male EACH package recipients lived with the care recipient compared to 79% of carers of female care recipients (Tables 4.12 and 4.13).

The proportion of care recipients with a carer ranged from 92% in Victoria and Tasmania to 78% in the Australian Capital Territory. Victoria also had the highest percentage of care recipients with a co-resident carer (79%), while South Australia and Tasmania had the lowest percentage of care recipients with a co-resident carer (55%) (Table 4.12).

4.7 Admissions and separations

There were 1,947 admissions to EACH packages in the period from 1 July 2005 to 30 June 2006 of which 58% were women and 42% were men. For women recipients admitted in the time period, 59% were aged 80 years or more and the corresponding proportion for men was 44% (Table 4.15).

There were 1,043 separations from EACH packages between 1 July 2005 and 30 June 2006. The main reasons for separation were admission to residential aged care (44%), death (35%), admission to hospital (9%) and the recipient withdrawing from the service (5%). A small number of care recipients changed to other forms of community care (3%), most of whom moved onto EACH Dementia packages (Table 4.16). Other reasons for stopping receipt of an EACH package included the care recipient moving out of the area and the provider no longer providing service to the care recipient. These figures should be interpreted cautiously as the program has been running for a relatively short period of time.

For separations between 1 July 2005 and 30 June 2006, 30% of separations had a length of stay of less than 3 months, 50% had a length of stay of at least 6 months and 25% of separations had length of stay at least 1 year (Table 4.17).
