

# 5 Glossary

<b>Admission</b>	A date on which the client begins to receive community aged care package assistance from the outlet. Admission date may also be referred to as 'date of commencement'.
<b>Birthplace (or country of birth)</b>	
<i>Other Oceania</i>	Includes New Zealand, New Caledonia, Papua New Guinea, Kiribati, Cook Islands, Fiji, American Samoa, and Tonga.
<i>UK and Ireland</i>	Includes Great Britain and Ireland.
<i>Former USSR &amp; Baltic States</i>	Includes Ukrainian SSR, USSR, and Byelorussian SSR.
<i>Other Europe</i>	Includes Albania, Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Malta, Portugal, Spain, Yugoslavia, Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Liechtenstein, Netherlands, Denmark, Finland, Norway, Sweden, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Poland, Romania, and Switzerland.
<i>Southeast Asia</i>	Includes Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Burma, the Philippines, Singapore, Viet Nam, East Timor, and Thailand.
<i>Northeast Asia</i>	Includes China, Hong Kong, Japan, Korea, and Macau.
<i>Southern Asia</i>	Includes Afghanistan, India, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka.
<i>Northern America</i>	Includes Canada and the United States of America.
<i>Other America &amp; the Caribbean</i>	Includes Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Paraguay, Uruguay, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Mexico, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Netherlands Antilles, British Virgin Islands, Jamaica, and Peru.
<i>The Middle East &amp; North Africa</i>	Includes Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Syrian Arab Republic, Turkey, Egypt, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mauritania, Sudan, and Kuwait.
<i>Africa (excluding North Africa)</i>	Includes United Republic of Cameroon, Central African Republic, Comoros, Kenya, Mauritius, South Africa, Seychelles, Swaziland, Zambia, Zimbabwe and Mozambique.
<b>Geographic areas</b>	
<i>Capital city</i>	State and Territory capital city statistical divisions
<i>Other metropolitan centre</i>	Urban centre of population 100,000 or more
<i>Large rural centre</i>	Urban centre population between 25,000 and 99,999
<i>Small rural centre</i>	Urban centre population between 10,000 and 24,999
<i>Other rural area</i>	Urban centre population less than 10,000
<i>Remote centre</i>	Urban centre population 5,000 or over
<i>Other remote area</i>	Urban centre population less than 5,000

<b>Leave</b>	A situation where the client temporarily ceases to receive services from the outlet to take a holiday, to enter hospital or to temporarily receive alternative care.
<b>Living arrangements</b>	Refers to the cohabitation prior to the client's application for a Community Aged Care Package.
<b>Low-level residential care</b>	Refers to general accommodation services provided in residential facilities, such as meals, laundry, and room cleaning, together with additional daily personal assistance such as bathing, showering, and personal hygiene. Care also includes organising and supervising and administering of medication; toileting and continence management; meal assistance; transfer; mobility; dressing/undressing; fitting of sensory/communication aids; assessment and referral for appropriate support; communication assistance; together with provision of special diets and emotional support.
<b>Preferred language</b>	
<i>Australian Indigenous</i>	Includes all Australian Indigenous languages.
<i>Northern European</i>	Includes Danish, German, Irish, Netherlandic, Norwegian, Swedish, Welsh, Yiddish, and Dutch.
<i>Southern European</i>	Includes French, Greek, Italian, Maltese, Portuguese, and Spanish.
<i>Eastern European</i>	Includes Albanian, Bosnian, Bulgarian, Croatian, Czech, Estonian, Finnish, Hungarian, Latvian, Lithuanian, Macedonian, Polish, Romanian, Russian, Serbian, Slovak, and Ukrainian.
<i>Southwest Asian and North African</i>	Includes Arabic, Turkish, Hebrew, and Persian.
<i>Southern Asian</i>	Includes Hindi, Tamil, Bengali, Sinhalese, and Urdu.
<i>Southeast Asian</i>	Includes Burmese, Khmer, Lao, Thai, Filipino, Bahasa (Indonesian & Malay), Timorese, and Vietnamese.
<i>Eastern Asian</i>	Includes Chinese (various dialects), Japanese, Korean.
<i>African</i>	Afrikaans.
<i>Oceanic</i>	Includes Fijian, Samoan, Tongan, and other South Pacific languages.
<b>Separation</b>	A situation when the client ceases to receive Community Aged Care Package service from an outlet. This does not mean that the client ceases to receive service from the Community Aged Care Package Program.

<b>Service-providing outlet</b>	An organisation or incorporated body which has been approved to provide Community Aged Care Package services. The outlet also has the responsibility to plan, coordinate, and manage the provision of community care services to its care recipients.
<b>Usual residence status</b>	Refers to the housing tenure prior to the client's application for a Community Aged Care Package.

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
