The second dot point in the section on Age distribution should read:

- The median age of first diagnosis for males was 69 years and for females was 65 years in 2001.

Page 8–Onset of cancer

In the first paragraph of the section on Onset of cancer should read:

Onset of cancer

In 2001 the average age of first diagnosis of a cancer for males was 66 years and the median age was 69 years. The average age of first diagnosis for females was 64 years and the median age was 65 years. For the overall population, the average age of first diagnosis was 65 years and the median age was 68 years.

Rather than:

In 2001 the average age of first diagnosis of a cancer for both males and females was 57 years. The median age of first diagnosis for males was 61 years and for females was 58 years. For the overall population, the average age of first diagnosis was 57 years and the median age was 60 years.
