


## Serving and ex-serving Australian Defence Force members who have served since 1985: Suicide monitoring 2001 to 2019







**373,500** Australians had served at least one day in the ADF since 1 January 1985. Of these, just over **358,000** were living as at 31 December 2019.



ADF members were five times more likely to be **male** than **female**.





**1,273** certified suicide deaths between 1 January 2001 and 31 December 2019 among those with at least one day of ADF service from 1985.



Permanent and Reserve males are about half as likely to die by suicide as Australian males.



Ex-serving **females** had a **lower** suicide rate than ex-serving males. However, it is **twice** as high as that for Australian females.



Ex-serving males aged 50 years and over had a lower suicide rate than those under 50 years.



Ex-serving males who separated voluntarily had a lower rate of suicide than those who separated for involuntary medical reasons.



Ex-serving males who served in the **Air Force** had a **lower** suicide rate than those who served in the Navy or Army.



Ex-serving males who served for 20 years or more had a rate of suicide about one-third the rate of those who served for less than a year.



Suicide rate for ex-serving males who separated as **commissioned officers** is about **half** the suicide rate of those who separated at all other ranks other than commissioned officers.
